

#### 2017 Math MCA Data





#### 2017 MCA Reading Data







### Identify Needs Based on Data

Adrian Public Schools Focus for 2017-2018:

- Initiative #1: We provide a tuition based early childhood program. Approximately 85% of the students attending our Kid's Connection enter our kindergarten program. Using all the resources we have, we will continue to work on preparing 100% our students to be ready for kindergarten when they leave our early childhood program.
- Initiative #2: Using all the resources we have available, we will continue to work towards preparing all our students to be grade level readers at the end of their 3<sup>rd</sup> grade year. Our goal for SY 17-18 is that we will improve our grades 3-5 Reading MCA/MTAS percent proficient from 63.5% in SY 16-17 to 65.5% in SY 17-18.
- Initiative #3: Increase efforts to maintain positive scores that close the achievement gap in all areas, especially our increasing English Language Learners population
- Initiative #4: Increase opportunities for our students to have the academic and social emotional skills to be career and college ready by the time they graduate.
- Initiative #5: Ensure that all students take the necessary coursework and perform academically to graduate from high school on time. Our focus is a 100% graduation rate

# Nobles County Integration Collaborative Achievement and Integration Plan

By 2020, the percentage of 3rd grade student in free and reduced lunch subgroups who are proficient in reading will increase by 6%

By 2020, 75% of teachers will report increased understanding of factors that contribute to achievement gaps and increase implementation of strategies designed to improve literacy.

By 2020, on a district administered survey, the percentage of students in grades 4, 5, 7 and 9 who report improved school climate will increase from 60%-70%.
