Christian Buck started this idea in the United States after seeing it on a German school's website. He started the idea with his principal and in 2013 the 2nd grader introduced it to his school in an assembly.

At least 1,000 elementary schools on six continents have installed buddy benches on their playgrounds.

Here at Adrian Elementary School the staff teaches about caring, sharing and respect with our anti-bullying messages. The Grand Prairie Rockets 4-H Club is donating the benches to help with our 2016 anti-bullying campaign. Plans are in place to teach the message "Wanted: Playground Buddy, Need a Friend? The following information highlights some important information we want all families to be aware of at AES.

Building Security Plan Update

Several years ago we started locking all entrances, except for the main entrance, after the school day was in session. This year we have made some changes to our Building Security Plan that will help us better maintain a safe and secure building for our students. Beginning Monday, September 19th anyone entering the building between the hours of 8:15-3:00 will need to wait in the vestibule area by the office. In order to enter the building, all visitors will need to use the Video Access Panel on the south wall of the vestibule area by the office.

In order to enter the building, all visitors will need to use the Video Access Panel on the south wall of the vestibule, and office staff will open the door after asking you to state your name and the purpose of your visit. Once you enter the building you will need to come into the office waiting area. Any visitor needing to go beyond the office area will need to sign the visitor log and wear a Visitor Badge. Upon leaving, each visitor will need to return to the office to sign out and return the Visitor Badge. In today's Friday Folder there is a more detailed document titled Adrian Elementary School Building Security Plan that includes additional information that will be helpful.
