

Junior High Knowledge Bowl Coach: Mr. Remme

The 2015 Junior High Knowledge Bowl Season is underway. There are 20 students in grades 7-9 participating in Junior High Knowledge Bowl this year. The meets are held on Monday evenings at 6:00 p.m. at area schools.

A little info on Junior High Knowledge Bowl: Competitions are academic contests designed for students in grades 7 – 9. During the contest, teams of students (5 students per team and 3 teams per room) compete in oral rounds by answering questions related to all areas of learning. There are 3 oral rounds per competition with 45 questions per round. Questions test students' recall, problem solving, and critical thinking skills. These competitions provide a format for student growth centered on academics.

Adrian has competed in three meets so far this year. Our remaining meets are at Jackson and Edgerton on November 16 and 30. The Sub-Regional Tournament will be December 18.
